#### Taking UOA for Granted

Prior to 1962, there was no **United Ostomy Association**. At one time there were no appliances to collect waste. Early ostomates tell how they cemented rubber gloves to their abdomen. We read about a lady who had a successful urostomy, but didn't know about the UOA. For three years she used gauze to absorb the fluid. She didn't leave the house.

It was the UOA that got manufacturers to develop appliances, belts and tape that we take for granted. It was the UOA that testified before Congress to get Public Law 92-603, dated October 20, 1992, to provide ostomy supplies through Medicare. They also removed the tax from all ostomy supplies. It was the UOA that was responsible in forming the 500+ chapters with membership of 40,000 in North America to help new ostomates as well as those who have had their ostomies for years.

When you have lived with a stoma five to ten years, it is just another chore like brushing your teeth. But think back to when you first found out you were going to be an ostomate! You had a hundred questions. Can I drive a car? Can I play golf? Or swim again? Will I ever be able to return to work? How will I live with this thing? Every hour you were awake you had another question.

At one time we had no chapters or ET nurses, and there was on one to provide you with answers. But thanks to UOA and thanks to many dedicated members through the years—this has changed.

Every ostomate who is living has a debt to repay to the persons who went before us to pave the way in improving our quality of Life. The debt is there, whether you pay it or not is up to you. **Think about it!** Attending monthly meetings and sharing with others is one way to repay the debt we all owe.

# Ostomate Bill of Rights (UOA version) The Ostomate Bill of Rights was presented to UOA by the International Association for Enterostomal Therapy (now known as the Wound, Ostomy and Continence Nurses Society) at the UOA House of Delegates Meeting during the Annual Conference in 1977. It is our goal to inform ostomates that all elements of quality care should be available to them. Ostomate Bill of Rights The ostomate shall: Be given pre-op counseling 2. Have an appropriately positioned stoma site 3. Have a well-constructed stoma 4. Have skilled postoperative nursing care Have emotional support Have individual instruction 7. Be informed on the availability of supplies 8. Be provided with information on community resources 9. Have post-hospital follow-up and life-long supervision 10. Benefit from team efforts of health care professionals 11. Be provided with information and counsel from the ostomy association and its members Adopted by the United Ostomy Association House of Delegates at the UOA Annual Conference 1977. Ostomate's Bill of Rights (IOA version) It is the declared objective of the International Ostomy Association that all ostomates shall have the right to a satisfactory quality of life after their surgery and that this charter shall be realized in all countries of the world. The Ostomate Shall: Receive preoperative counseling to ensure that they are fully aware of the benefits of the operation and the essential facts about living with a stoma. Have a well-constructed stoma placed at an appropriate site, and with full and proper consideration to the comfort of the patient. Receive experienced and professional medical support and stoma nursing care in the preoperative and postoperative period both in hospital and in their community. Receive full and impartial information about all relevant supplies and products available in their country. Have the opportunity to choose from the available variety of ostomy management products without prejudice or constraint. Be given information about their National Ostomy Association and the services and support which can be provided. Receive support and information for the benefit of the family, personal care givers, and friends to increase their understanding of the conditions and adjustments which are necessary for achieving a satisfactory standard of life with a stoma. Receive assurance that personal information regarding Ostomy surgery will be treated with discretion and confidentiality to maintain privacy.
